

John - Chapter 7 - Session 23

[John 7:1-5 ESV]

1 After this Jesus went about in Galilee. He would not go about in Judea, because the Jews were seeking to kill him. 2 Now the Jews' Feast of Booths was at hand. 3 So his brothers said to him, "Leave here and go to Judea, that your disciples also may see the works you are doing. 4 For no one works in secret if he seeks to be known openly. If you do these things, show yourself to the world." 5 For not even his brothers believed in him.

[Matthew 13:55-56 ESV]

Is not this the carpenter's son? Is not his mother called Mary? And are not his brothers James and Joseph and Simon and Judas? 56 And are not all his sisters with us?

[Matthew 12:46-50 ESV]

While he was still speaking to the people, behold, his mother and his brothers stood outside, asking to speak to him... 48 But he replied to the man who told him, "Who is my mother, and who are my brothers?" 49 And stretching out his hand toward his disciples, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! 50 For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother."

[Mark 3:21 ESV]

And when his family heard it, they went out to seize him, for they were saying, "He is out of his mind."

[1 Corinthians 15:3-7 ESV]

[Jesus] was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, 5 and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve... 7 Then he appeared to James...

[John 7:6 ESV]

Jesus said to them, "My time has not yet come, but your time is always here. 7 The world cannot hate you, but it hates me because I testify about it that its works are evil. 8 You go up to the feast. I am not going up to this feast, for my time has not yet fully come."

[Luke 16:13-14 NIV]

The Pharisees, who loved money, heard all this and were sneering at Jesus.

[John 3:19-20 ESV]

And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil. 20 For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his works should be exposed.

[John 7:9-13 ESV]

9 After saying this, he remained in Galilee. 10 But after his brothers had gone up to the feast, then he also went up, not publicly but in private. 11 The Jews were looking for him at the feast, and saying, "Where is he?" 12 And there was much muttering about him among the people. While some said, "He is a good man," others said, "No, he is leading the people astray." 13 Yet for fear of the Jews no one spoke openly of him.

[Matthew 12:30 ESV]

Whoever is not with me is against me, and whoever does not gather with me scatters.

[John 7:14-15 ESV]

14 About the middle of the feast Jesus went up into the temple and began teaching. 15 The Jews therefore marveled, saying, "How is it that this man has learning, when he has never studied?"

[Luke 4:22 ESV]

And all spoke well of him and marveled at the gracious words that were coming from his mouth.

[Matthew 13:54 ESV]

and coming to his hometown he taught them in their synagogue, so that they were astonished, and said, "Where did this man get this wisdom and these mighty works?

[Matthew 7:28-29 ESV]

And when Jesus finished these sayings, the crowds were astonished at his teaching, 29 for he was teaching them as one who had authority, and not as their scribes.

[John 7:16-18 ESV]

So Jesus answered them, "My teaching is not mine, but his who sent me. 17 If anyone's will is to do God's will, he will know whether the teaching is from God or whether I am speaking on my own authority. 18 The one who speaks on his own authority seeks his own glory; but the one who seeks the glory of him who sent him is true, and in him there is no falsehood.
